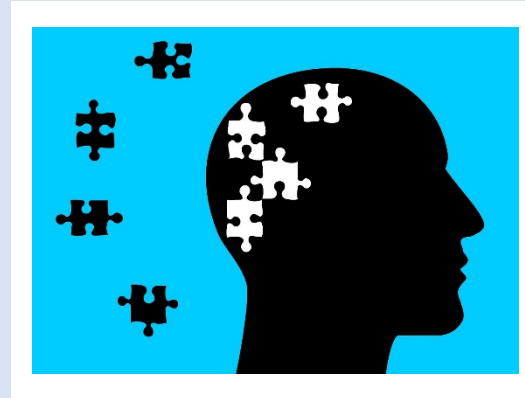


Heads Together - Understanding Acquired Brain Injury
